

Child Abuse Prevention Month

In 2019, **1,094** child abuse or neglect cases were investigated by the Department for Children and Families in Saline County.

The 189 children who were child victims of physical or sexual abuse and/or witnessed a violent crime received advocacy, a medical exam and care by trained SANE/SART staff, referral to trauma focused mental health services or a forensic interview at Chris's Place - Child Advocacy Center, a program of CAPS. These services are delivered through a multi-disciplinary collaboration between City of Salina and Saline County law enforcement, CAPS. Salina Regional Health Center, Department for Children and Families Child Protective Custody, Saline County Attorney's Office, Central Kansas Mental

Health Center and private therapists.

Pinwheel Garden

The pinwheel is the national symbol for child abuse prevention. There will be two gardens travelling across town. Both gardens are to create awareness for child survivors of abuse. One will be at business locations and the other will travel through Salina neighborhood. Participants can sign up in advance to have the garden delivered to friends and family's yard for \$25 each. Our partners, Bikers Against Child Abuse (BACA) will help deliver the gardens.

Simple Ways to Cool Off Before You Blow Up At Your Child

No one said it would be easy to be a parent. When everyday pressures build up to a point where you feel like lashing out, STOP. Try these tips instead. You'll feel better. So will your child.

- 1. Take a deep breath. And another. Remember, you are the adult.
- 2. Close your eyes. Pretend you're hearing what your child is about to hear.
- Press your lips together and count to 10. Better yet, count to 20.
- 4. Put yourself time-out. Think about why you are angry: is it your child, or is your child simply a convenient target for your anger?
- 5. Phone a friend.
- 6. If someone can watch your child, go outside and take a walk.
- 7. Take a hot bath.
- 8. Splash water on your face.
- 9. Hug a pillow.
- 10. Turn on some music. Maybe even sing along.
