Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA)



This past fiscal year, **36 CASA volunteers** spent **1,790 hours** changing the stories of **48 children** in Saline and Ottawa County foster care.

Parenting Education

115 adults in 108 families attended one of the **44 virtual or in person** Parenting Education sessions offered by CAPS instructors. **3 families** enrolled in an individual study Personal Parenting Class. CAPS

Parenting Education YouTube videos were viewed 640 times.

Saline County School Readiness



In FY20, **220 children** 0-5 years of age in 189 **families** received developmental screenings and support from their **35 child care settings**. This service focused on making sure early identification

of developmental delays occurs as soon as possible to allow for the maximum intervention before the child enters school. Staff also provided coaching and professional development for 75 child care professionals in Saline County to give their children high quality learning environments and parents with the education about appropriate child development.

Chris's Place - Child Advocacy Center



Chris's Place served **477 child victims and non-offending caregivers** in FY20. These children received a forensic interview, a sexual assault examination when needed, victim advocacy, court

accompaniment, and most importantly referral to trauma-focused therapy. The demographic details for these special children include the following:

Happy Bear



With help from Fili Creative and some talented children, Happy Bear went virtual! The Happy Bear YouTube video was accessed **504 times** by educators to bring Happy Bear to their classrooms.

Respite Care



Parents and caregivers in **49 families** received care for **73 children** between 8 weeks and 5 years of age. Three-hour stress breaks were provided each week totaling **974 sessions** of high

quality child care, reducing risk for child abuse and increasing assessment for appropriate child development.

Bullying Prevention



Bullying Prevention services were held virtually via Zoom. Services were provided to **1,723 children** and **117 educators** and school staff members across **90 sessions**.

Family Mentoring and Support



Family Mentoring and Support employs **8.5 fulltime staff**, including **4 full-time bilingual staff** members. Service is provided to Saline and Ottawa families in their homes, virtually or in

office. Parenting education classes and mentoring services are offered in both English and Spanish.
